

Tone	The emotion that the author is feeling as they write.	Bitter Regretful Sorrowful
Emotive words	Words that create an emotion.	Brave Heroic Humiliation
Metaphor	A figure of speech that compares unlike objects.	Your brother is a pig.
Symbol	An image that represents something else.	A dove is a symbol of peace.
Imagery	Creates a picture in your mind.	A host, of golden daffodils; Beside the lake, beneath the trees, Fluttering and dancing in the breeze.
Simile	A comparison usually using the words 'like' or 'as'.	As busy as a bee.
Theme	The central idea of the poem; what it is about.	Death Love War
Personification	When animals or objects are said to have human characteristics.	The sun smiled on the grass below. The stars danced playfully.
Alliteration	The repetition of one or more initial letters.	Delightful daffodils Sleepy soldiers
Rhyme	When two or more words have the same sound at the end of a sentence.	Toil; oil Mother; brother
Repetition	When a sentence or phrase is repeated. A poet does this for effect.	Repeated use of a line at the start of a stanza.
Structure	The organisation of a poem including how many stanzas it has.	Is it regular or irregular? How many stanzas has it got?
Stanza	A technical name for a verse.	Stanzas in a poem can be the same size or irregular.
Attitude	The poem will show the poet's attitude to something.	Angry words in war poetry shows that the poet thinks war is bad.
